- 1. Fiscal Stability: We received a clean audit and implemented a minimum fund balance requirement to make sure we are positioned to address future unforeseen situations.
- 2. City Rebranding: The City is in the process of developing branding strategies to project our unique identity and heighten our sense of civic pride. Be on the lookout for the opportunity to provide your input to help reimagine the City of Clemson's identity.
- **3.** Green Space: The City received a grant from the SC Conservation Bank to acquire the approximately four acres at the corner of Berkeley and Issaqueena in order to retain it as green space.
- 4. Arts and Culture: The Clemson Area African American Museum completed the second successful Sunday Concert Series this past spring and is preparing for an eventful Fall. Likewise, The Arts Center had a busy spring and summer participating in Artisphere and Camp Clemson and has a full slate of family fun planned for the next few months. - **5. Transportation:** We have partnered with Clemson University, the Greenville-Pickens Area Transportation Study and several neighboring counties to initiate a Regional traffic study. This is the first step in seeking funding to help improve our transportation system.
- 6. Youth Sports: Our joint Recreation department works tirelessly to provide sports of all kinds and at all levels to our youth. It's always great to watch the kids of our community as they learn and grow in and through sports. It is especially fantastic when we get to celebrate big wins. To that end, Congratulations are in order once again to the Central/Clemson 13U Baseball team for a repeat World Series Championship! (And thank you to all of the "grown ups" that pour into these young men!)
